Parish Council Chairman's Report

This has been another busy year for the Parish Council. The regular monthly meetings have been well attended by Councillors. We welcome members of the public to our meetings but request questions in writing before the meetings.

The three notice boards within the parish at No Man's Land, Windsworth and Millendreath help to keep residents informed of activities within the parish and the work of the parish council. Thanks to the councillors who keep them up to date. Some work needs to be done to repair the one at No Man's Land.

The speed of traffic through the village on the B3253 remains a concern despite the improved pavements. There is still a blind spot when crossing the road towards Bindown. We welcome the movement of the bus stop on the south side of the road although our campaign for a bus shelter has been refused. The new bus shelter on the northern side of the road is a great improvement

Two of the fingerposts in the parish at Keveral Lane and Penshoey are in a very poor state of repair and the clerk endeavours to get appropriate

The roads in the parish which were surface dressed two years ago are beginning to show signs of wear with potholes appearing. Concerns over the road from Polborder to Millendreath have been raised by horse riders. Most of the road was surface dressed last summer making the surface much more suitable for horses with road shoes. However the lower part of the road which is very steep in parts was not completed and has been left in a very dangerous condition for horse riders. Cornwall Council has promised to complete the surface dressing in the new financial year.

Little development has occurred at Millendreath although the café has now re-opened with an additional bar area.

Councillor John Broad was forced to retire from the council due to ill health during the current year and we were pleased to be able to co-opt Simon Lawes to replace him.

Many thanks to our Cornwall Councillor Armand Toms, for all his hard work in this parish and East Looe.

My thanks to our clerk, Charles Hyde for all the hard work he puts in to enable the smooth running of the council and all he does to edit and produce the quarterly parish magazine on our behalf.

Classic Summer Berry Sorbet

Ingredients

- **1.** 500g fresh summer fruits juice and grated rind of 1 large orange
- **2.** 2 3 tbsp orange liqueur such as Cointreau or Grand Marnier
- 3. 2 egg whites
- 4. 100g caster sugar



Method

- **1.** Place the fruit, orange rind and juice, liqueur and 175ml water in a food processor and blend until smooth. I like to leave to seeds in but you can sieve your mixture if you prefer.
- **2.** If you have an ice cream machine, churn the mixture until it starts to freeze, alternatively pour into a rigid container and freeze, stirring every 30 minutes or so until ice crystals start to form and it feels slushy.
- **3.** Whisk the egg whites until stiff then gradually add the sugar beating until firm and glossy. Fold the meringue into the freezing fruit mixture and continue to freeze and stir until completely frozen. If making in advance, transfer the mixture to the fridge 30 minutes before serving.


difficulties in Holland Road the committee wish to see the residents using it, but it has to be maintained and to avoid closure we feel the small annual charge is justified.

History Snippet Language in the Landscape

The field names in the 1840 'Tithe' Map of the Parish are mostly Old English words brought here by the Anglo-Saxons. So the language has lingered for a thousand years – and gone out of fashion!

Translating the words gives us clues to our past.

Skreeks Hill, Trelowia – A hill where burial mounds were.

Borough Park, Bucklawren – A field where the hill fort used to be.

Little Eaver, Keverall – Small field on the boundary.

Manna Park, Trelowia - Common land.

Veralls, Lower Treveria – A communal enterprise.

Dovers, by Great Tree – A slow moving stream, wetland.

Shutter Field, Hay – A field by a fast moving stream.

Runnels Hill, Trelowia – A hill with a small stream.

Sheral, Lower Treveria – Sparking brook going down a slope.

Vellaway, Trelowia – The land on thr road to the mill.

Cony Gates, Longcoe – The land en route to the rabbit warren. (NB:

Bunny Field belonged to Mr. Bunny!).

Chall Plots, Bucklawren and Keverall – Chalky soil – Loam.

Lamma Park, Penfieth - Area of loamy soil.

Melvinia, Keverall by Struddicks – Latin for black grapes!

Spire Marsh, Keverall – Hessenford – Area where reeds grew.

Elins, Hellens (Bodigga), Eliens (Bucklawren) – Alder trees grew here.

Canna Park, Knights Trevery – Field descending into a hollow.

Banka Park, Knights Trevery – Field on a ridge.

Kidenap, Keverall – Hill where you see the kites.

Catta Ball, Longcoe – Round hill that belonged to Ceatta.

Delabowl, Bucklawren – Round hill with leafy vegetation.

Ball Park, Trefrome – Field on a round hill.

Gunner Down, Bokenver - Open downland (in Cornish!).

*Wimble Field, Bokenver by the Beacon Fields near the Trigpoint. (A wimble is an auger for boring holes). The field where holes were bored! Is this where they fired the gunpowder on Midsummers Day?

* See Autumn 2016 edition).

Trefrone Garriter, on the cliff below Murraytown. The area was always retained by the lord of the manor of Pendrym. C14th French word 'garite' is 'watchtower'. Can anyone provide anymore information?

It may have to be replaced after Brexit!

Allium Ursinum



May Bank Holiday this year started fine and dry but unfortunately turned a little cold and wet. It wasn't enough though to dampen the spirits of some friends and family who had travelled to Cornwall for a birthday celebration, some of whom were visiting the County for the first time, and even with the aid of a sat nav, managed to get themselves lost travelling from Duloe to Trefrome!!

Some surprise was expressed as to how narrow the lanes were and that some had grass growing in the middle – townies you may say, but no, these comments were from people living in rural Suffolk. Despite weather and road conditions a good time was had by all.

Summer is on the way, the signs are there – in the garden wild flowers are going through their flowering cycle. Gone are the snowdrops and daffodils, primroses have been in flower since January, bluebells are in full bloom and together with the red campions and meadow buttercups they have taken over the grassy area under the blossoming cherry trees.

One wild flower not so welcome is the Allium Ursinum, common name Ramson, or wild garlic. Left unchecked these plants can completely take over the garden or any area where their seeds disperse.

Allium Ursinum

Virtually impossible to eradicate completely due to their profusion, they can though be controlled with a little time and effort. Very common at this time of year, their white spiky flowers can be seen along roadsides and especially in wooded areas. The entire plant can be eaten – their leaves can be used in salads, the bulbs used as you would spring onions, but beware they are a little strong. When these plants encroach on to pasture land grazed by cattle it can taint their milk which can then have a distinct hint of garlic. Some of you who have a taste for fine cheese may know that a variety of Cornish Yarg has a rind coated in wild garlic leaves. There are recipes for various dishes using this plant from places as far away as Russia, Turkey, Switzerland and Denmark, with evidence that the species has been used for food for animals and humans for many thousands of years.

One note of caution – Allium Ursinum can be mistaken for a small number of poisonous plants – notably Lily of the Valley – so as always when foraging for wild food, never use anything that you cannot positively identify.

Here's hoping that the Summer allows us all to participate in those recreational activities that we all enjoy.
