Agenda Item 8: Reports on Matters arising from the Minutes. Items 8.1.1 to 8.1.5 Presented by the Clerk.

8.1.1: Bus Shelter Lighting – The motion activated light is still in good working order, however it is very dark on the pavement and the Clerk recommends a dusk to dawn or timer activated solar light be installed on the front of the shelter, by the entrance.

Additional lighting to be explored, the Clerk thanked Councillor Spicer for all the links sent re: Solar Lighting, also Health and Safety issues investigated by the Clerk.

8.1.2: Buses Not Stopping – The Clerk contacted CityBus who replied by telephone that they would contact Cornwall Council and recommend a bus stop box be painted onto the road, to ensure drivers can see the stop, also they will look into moving the flag to a pole on the pavement. It would need to be properly designed but there are some Nation Grid power poles that could potentially be utilised, which may help keep the cost down. Do you think the parish council could fund something or maybe do it as a Community Network Panel scheme?

8.1.4: Kilmartin Cornish Hedgerows – The Clerk investigated this matter, and it turns out the application form submitted stated that no hedges or trees nearby or adjacent would be affected, this was not picked up by planning and therefore no action can be taken by The Enforcement Team.

8.1.5: Tamar Bridge Consultation – The Clerk submitted the Parish Council's thoughts re: the proposed changes to the toll on the bridge, this was circulated to all Parish Councillors, the following email was received in reply to our submission:

Thank you for forwarding the Council's feedback concerning the Public Consultation on funding the Tamar Bridge and Torpoint Ferry crossings. The comments will be collated and incorporated within further reports to the Committee.

In response to the question regarding ownership, the 1957 Tamar Bridge Act established a joint undertaking in public ownership which continues to be the case. We are not unaware of any provisions in the 1957 Act or supporting documentation that suggested or mandated a change in status of either following settlement of the debt incurred to build the bridge. The 1957 Act contained provisions which allowed tolls continue to support the maintenance and operation of the crossings after the original debt had been extinguished.

I also note that the Committee funded research undertaken by the owning Councils related to a Western Park and Ride Scheme a decade ago. The summary final report and related minutes can be found at https://democracy.cornwall.gov.uk/ieListDocuments.aspx?Cld=620&Mld=1781&Ver=4 (Minute TBTF/28).

Councillor Reynolds:

Unreliable Bus Service – A Parishioner has raised an issue about bus reliability, Buses fail to turn up resulting in an additional 2 hour wait, the reasons given are faulty buses, with fuel leaks. Also, late buses often miss connecting buses, making some journeys long and in some cases impossible as important health related appointments are being missed.

B3253 Visibility Down Toward Tregoad from Bucklawren Road, Junction – A Parishioner has reported poor visibility down the hill to towards Tregoad. The Clerk mentioned hedges are in the process of being cut and he would monitor the situation.

Councillor Spicer:

Nothing raised.

Councillor Lawes:

Noticeboard Has Blown Down and is in need of Complete Replacement – County Councillor Armand toms suggested the Clerk contact the Clerk for Duloe as they have recently had a now noticeboard installed at a reasonable price.

Vice Chair Powley:

Holland Road Estate Footpaths – In front of two properties the footpaths are impassable, Vice Chairman Powley has reported this to Cornwall Housing, and it is on the list to be done.

County Councillor Armand Toms:

Looe Hill – Damaged by Massive Flood – Cormac will be repairing the road shortly and signage has been erected.

A38 Safety Works – County Councillor Armand Toms shared the following statistics which he will use to prepare a press release to try to get the works done sooner than 2030.

Highway - Carkeel Roundabout the Truerulefoot :2018 - 2022.

Cost to the County of accidents, £11,860.000.00.

Highway - Trerulefoot to Dobwalls: 2018 – 2022.

Cost to County of accidents, £5,552.000.00.

Highway - Dobwalls to Bodmin: 2018 - 2022.

Cost to County of accidents, £4,153.000.00

A total cost to the county of £21,565.000.00 just dealing with accidents.

A38 has been identified as being 2½ times more dangerous than the average A road in the

These costs could be saved if the safety works were brought forward from the proposed 2030 date.
